MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD





Ladies and gentlemen, Dear Members and Partners,

2022 will forever hold the privilege of being the one that saw the birth of this proactive initiative carried out under the auspices of Fondation Humanité ASBL. It was created in a socially challenging global context, specifically characterized by the detrimental effects of Covid-19 pandemic, which not only claimed millions of lives worldwide but also left behind an unprecedented economic and social crisis.

The advent of Fondation Humanité ASBL was, in reality, and above all, an urgent response to the distress shaking our fellow human beings. Nearly 500 people responded to this call and gathered under the banner of this Foundation.



It is within this framework that the interventions of the Fondation Humanité ASBL, during its first year of existence, were directed towards several areas to provide assistance to the most vulnerable categories of our society, including children and the sick, war-displaced persons and orphans, the elderly, residents of vulnerable and remote localities, beneficiaries of clean water and protection against erosion in their environment, as well as numerous vulnerable young people and adults, men and women based in Lubumbashi and Bukavu who have benefited from vocational training enabling them to acquire skills to help them establish income-generating activities and thus become financially and socially autonomous.

During 2023, which has just ended, Fondation Humanité ASBL refocused its activities mainly on the Education sector, which is indeed its preferred domain. This year was also marked by an indelible imprint, namely the inauguration and operationalization of Complexe Scolaire Humanité, based in Ngomba-Kinkusa, on the outskirts of the Ngaliema Commune in Kinshasa. Several other actions in terms of financial assistance and furniture distribution were carried out in favor of some schools located in four provinces of the country. It is also during this year that more than 138 vulnerable individuals completed their various vocational training courses.

2024, which is commencing, aims notably to consolidate the actions already undertaken and ongoing, mainly in the Education sector. The initiation of the five-year project «KELASI» will have to move to another phase in its implementation process.

As the circle of Fondation Humanité ASBL continues to expand, its scope of intervention also increases and expands further. We reiterate our thanks to all members and contributors for their priceless contributions, which enable them, through the Fondation Humanité ASBL, to promote access to education for vulnerable categories of our society, to be loving fathers for orphans, a refuge for distressed souls, a treasure for the poor, and a remedy for the sick...

Together, let's contribute to the transformation of our society!

Vision, Objectives, Principles, and Values

By its name, the Fondation Humanité ASBL, as a Non-Profit Association, is a call to our sense of humanism and to the heartfelt actions that we can collectively take, on the one hand, in favor of our fellow human beings who find themselves in situations of vulnerability or precariousness, and on the other hand, as a protagonist of social development through actions that we are called upon to carry out in certain specific environments of our society. We contribute our modest contribution to individual and collective transformation, thereby strengthening our social cohesion.

Inspired by Baha'i teachings, Fondation Humanité ASBL aims to translate into action these two thoughts:

« the purpose for which mortal men have, from utter nothingness, stepped into the realm of being, is that they may work for the betterment of the world and live together in concord and harmony » and « The more the qualities of cooperation and mutual assistance are manifested by a people, the more human society progresses and prospers ».

The main purpose of Fondation Humanité ASBL is to provide holistic support, as urgent and long-term responses, to the multiple needs of well-targeted and vulnerable populations, in order to contribute, to some extent, to the improvement of their daily lives, particularly through individual and collective transformation.

Certainly, we must not overlook the responsibility of our leaders in improving the socio-economic conditions of populations, but it would also be inaccurate to think that we have no role to play in contributing to the individual and collective transformation of our society by performing acts of solidarity, mutual support, and assistance to our fellow human beings living in precarious situations.

We cannot remain indifferent, especially when we see the deplorable situation of our fellow human beings in general. We have the capacity to unleash the power of rebuilding our society to even higher degrees.

The Foundation focuses primarily on the education sector, where it aims to facilitate access to education for vulnerable categories of society. Educational interventions may include both the construction and operation of schools, as well as assistance, in various forms, provided to other schools for their better functioning.



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As part of its holistic approach, when the Fondation Humanité ASBL intervenes in favor of a well-targeted vulnerable population, it may aim for several specific objectives, including to:

- ensure better quality education, in all its forms, and access to education for vulnerable and deprived categories of the community;
- promote Women, particularly in the field of literacy, to enable them to take charge of themselves through income-generating activities;

• contribute to health coverage for all, notably through the development and operationalization of health structures;

- protect and fight environmental degradation, by proposing and implementing rehabilitation and environmental preservation measures, particularly in mining areas and localities affected by mining and oil exploitation activities;
- implement projects in the health and agriculture sectors, particularly by training and guiding vulnerable population categories in agricultural technics, as well as in the creation of agro-pastoral cooperatives;
- provide, when needed, minimal training and support to artisanal miners and promote their activities;
- provide technical and material support for community initiatives to strengthen social cohesion and empower vulnerable individuals;
- undertake and implement any project, activity, and initiative aimed at providing helpful support to vulnerable populations.

Fondation Humanité ASBL is built on the following values: unity, reliability, mutual support, collaboration, accountability, justice, and equity.

Official Recognition

After the approval and signing of its Articles of Association and Internal Regulations, the Fondation Humanité ASBL received legal approval to operate as a Non-Profit Association, abbreviated as ASBL, registered under Number F.92/46.729 of February 23, 2022.

In this capacity, it is governed by Law No. 004/2001 of July 20, 2001, on General Provisions Applicable to Non-Profit Associations and Public Utility Establishments.

On behalf of the Head of Government, the Deputy Chief of Staff of the Prime Minister officially and solemnly launched the activities of the Humanity Foundation on Tuesday, March 1, 2022, in Kinshasa, during a ceremony bringing together its founders, its first members, distinguished guests, and public authorities

Shortly after its launch, the circle of the Fondation Humanité ASBL expanded with the accession of new members not only from Kinshasa but also from three other provinces of the country, namely Haut-Katanga, Nord, and Sud Kivu. At the end of its first year of existence, the Fondation Humanité ASBL counted 463 members. This number rose to 652 by the end of 2023, distributed as follows: Kinshasa: 77; Grand Kivu: 422; Grand Katanga: 135; Grand Kasaï: 18.

Organs and Structures

In accordance with the provisions of Article 16 of its Articles of Association, the Fondation Humanité ASBL consists of three bodies, namely

- The General Assembly (GA);
- The Board of Directors (BD); and
- The Executive Bureau (EB).

General Assembly, as per the terms of Article 17 of the Statutes, is the decision-making and deliberative body of the Foundation. It is composed of all founding, active, and honorary members. Without prejudice to paragraph 1 of this article, honorary or sympathetic members participate in General Assembly meetings without deliberative voice.

In reference to Article 24 of the Foundation's Statutes, the Board of Directors is the body responsible for ensuring the implementation or execution of General Assembly resolutions.

The Board of Directors is vested with the broadest powers to manage the Foundation and authorize any act or operation falling within the Foundation's scope, except those expressly devolved to the General Assemblies.

Regarding Coordination and in accordance with Article 26 of the Foundation's Statutes, it is the body responsible for the day-to-day management of the organization. In this capacity, it is entrusted with a general mission to achieve the Foundation's objectives, ensures proper management of the Foundation's assets and resources, and provides ongoing oversight of delegated activities and missions.

It is under the direction of a Coordinator, assisted by a Deputy Coordinator.

The offices of the Fondation Humanité ASBL are located at Number 8, Avenue Province, in the Golf District of the Gombe Commune, in Kinshasa. Beyond Kinshasa and considering its national vocation, the Fondation Humanité ASBL is already present in eight (8) Provinces of the Democratic Republic of Congo, namely Haut-Katanga, Lualaba, Tanganyika, North Kivu, South Kivu, Kasai, Kasai-Central, and Western Kasai.

2. Administration and coordination of Foundation activities







Invested with the mission to manage daily operations and translate the Foundation's vision into reality, the national coordination functioned regularly and permanently throughout the year. Its offices were open for 295 days out of the 365 in the year.

During the year, the Foundation maintained contacts with various administrative services, fulfilling all required formalities and paying all fees due to operate in accordance with the law.

Furthermore, the Fondation Humanité ASBL Coordination maintained contacts with some external partners. In this context, experts attended the annual review on the evaluation of achievements and actions conducted by Faith World in Action (FWA) and its partners. Continuing in the same vein, FH was in contact with Laboria Forum, the Think Tank organized by the Presidency of the Republic, and the Africa and Europe Same Horizon exchange framework, among others.

- Laboria Forum: this forum provided an opportunity to familiarize oneself with the measures put in place by government structures to support young entrepreneurs, and to exchange views with government representatives;
- AFRESH (Africa and Europe Same Horizon): a framework for exchanging and sharing experiences and cultures to define and maintain relations between Africa and Europe. In this space, the various participants presented the projects they have been working on to contribute to change.

The Foundation's Coordination maintained interaction with its various members to raise awareness and keep them informed about the progress of its activities, primarily through our platforms, mainly WhatsApp and other social networks. Through its website www.fhasbl.org as well as its Facebook accounts (Fondation Humanité ASBL and Complexe scolaire Humanité); Tik Tok (fondation30humanite), YouTube (Fondation Humanité), and Instagram (Fondation Humanité), the Coordination published 39 posts informing the general public about some of the activities carried out.



During the year 2023, the President of the Board of Directors and some members of the national coordination conducted itinerant missions in the provinces of Haut Katanga, Lualaba, Kasai, North and South Kivu.

On July 1, 2023, the Coordination organized the first General Assembly of FH during which there was approval of the 2022 activity report and, on the other hand, analysis and adoption of the plan and budget for the 2023 fiscal year.

Based on the approved budget of USD 514,386.60, the Coordination managed to mobilize 90% of said budget and wishes to thank the members for their generosity.

With the resources mobilized, out of eleven (11) main activities selected in the action plan, the Coordination managed to execute nine (9), fully and/or in progress, representing an execution rate of approximately 82%.



3. Major achievements



Among the accomplishments of the Fondation Humanité ASBL during the year 2023, the most significant include:

- the inauguration and operationalization of the Complexe Scolaire Humanité in a peripheral and isolated neighborhood of Kinshasa;
- generous vocational training for 138 vulnerable youth and adults, men and women, in Lubumbashi and Bukavu:
- distribution of 88 desks, 100 chairs, 5 cabinets, 25 writing tables, and 13 boards to five (5) schools in South Kivu:
- distribution of 170 desks to 5 schools and 20 sheets of metal to one school in Lubumbashi in Haut Katanga;
- financial support for the rehabilitation of two (2) schools, one based in Baraka in South Kivu and the second in Lukalaba in the Kasaï Oriental province;
- distribution of a batch of medicines to the General Military Reference Hospital of Camp Kokolo and the Hospice for the Elderly in Kabinda, Kinshasa;
- raising awareness among the local population and contributing to erosion control work in Ngomba Kinkusa. Kinshasa.

The following lines attempt to outline the details of these major achievements.

A. Complexe Scolaire Humanité (CSH): a Sustainable Solution

«Ignorance is the fundamental cause of misdeeds; that is why we must firmly attach ourselves to the instruments of perception and knowledge.»

In the Democratic Republic of Congo, access to quality education remains a major challenge for the younger generation, mainly due to prohibitive costs and the lack of adequate infrastructure in most urban areas.

The Ngomba-Kinkusa neighbourhood is one of many micro-regions facing this enormous challenge. It is an isolated neighborhood, difficult to access, located on the outskirts of the Ngaliema Commune in Kinshasa, with a predominantly modest-income population.

Due to the lack of quality schools in the neighbourhood, for parents who can afford it, children are forced to travel long distances to find better options, with the risks of mobility, accidents, and related abandonment.

It is with the aim of addressing the aforementioned constraints and to alleviate the suffering of parents and children that Fondation Humanité ASBL, an organization aiming for social change, built Complexe Scolaire Humanité there; an initiative that aligns with its objectives of facilitating access to quality education for young people and children of all backgrounds.



Having obtained the necessary authorizations from the competent authority, Complexe Scolaire Humanité opened its doors for the 2023-2024 school year, providing children with a dignified, comfor-

table, and secure environment, as well as quality education; all at an affordable price.

Currently, the organized sections are the Kindergarten (complete cycle) and the Primary school. Basic Education (7th and 8th grades) will open its doors next September. Afterwards, there will be high school, with options that take into account the reality and needs of the neighbourhood.

Complexe Scolaire Humanitéaims to be a school of excellence, going beyond mere instruction to offer comprehensive and quality education to students. It promotes values such as fraternity, discipline, excellence, and selfless service to the community by creating a new generation of individuals who will work for the advent of a materially and spiritually prosperous world.

Certainly, the value of education in the work of building a new civilization is unequivocal. This is what justifies the establishment of the Complexe Scolaire Humanité, a school that aims to offer quality education, starting with young children, with the goal of changing the social context of the locality.



It was enough to observe the enthusiasm among the inhabitants of this locality who took part in the dedication ceremony with an atmosphere of joy and jubilation, seeing such a gem implanted in this remote corner of the city.

Here are some reactions from members of the Ngomba-Kinkusa community:

- 1. Mother Espérance Mbenze: «The schools in this area are substandard both in infrastructure and education. We were neglected in terms of education. Thanks to the Humanity Foundation, we can dare to hope. If we have failed, our children will not fail. Complexe Scolaire Humanité and us will work to ensure a bright future for our children.»
- 2. The chief of this locality, Mr. Justin Bueya, said: «Complexe Scolaire Humanité is a gift... We now have a high-class school in the heart of the village as if we were in downtown Gombe.»
- 3. A grandmother is so moved that she feels like she's living a dream: «An internationally standard school in a village. This is unheard of!»

«Regard man as a mine rich in gems of inestimable value. Education can, alone, cause it to reveal its treasures, and enable mankind to benefit therefrom.»

Inspired by this quote, all the staff of Complexe Scolaire Humanité ensure that each student receives appropriate education by creating a disciplined environment that fosters learning and using a compassionate language. The approach used is a competency-based approach.

For any educational institution that seeks to be modern, it is imperative to ensure that a student does not miss a single lesson, even the teaching staff and anyone else involved in children's education.

At Complexe Scolaire Humanité, the student is placed at the center of their learning and receives education in three dimensions:

- The theoretical dimension: not only limited to rich content to impart scientific knowledge to students but also to endow them with qualities and values;
- The practical dimension: aims at skills development;
- The real dimension: field trips that allow students to experience the realities of their environment.

Complexe Scolaire Humanité offers a unique educational experience as it reconciles scientific, spiritual, and moral education to release the invaluable potential inherent in every human being.

Furthermore, to address emergencies or accidents that may occur during teaching, Complexe Scolaire Humanité has equipped itself with an infirmary to provide first aid.

In addition to its strictly pedagogical aspect focused on children's education, Complexe Scolaire Humanité aims to be a centre of light from which community reflections are stimulated and actions initiated to address the social problems of the environment..

During this first year of operation, it is observed that the Complexe Scolaire Humanité, through all the activities it organizes with a hundred of its first students, plays the role of a center of radiation, injecting new energy, participating in the emergence of a new culture and new habits in collective work, and creating a spirit of service among the inhabitants of Ngomba Kinkusa.

B. Generous training for vulnerable individuals

«Man is the supreme Talisman. Lack of a proper education hath, however, deprived him of that which he doth inherently possess.»

In the Democratic Republic of Congo, as in many countries around the world, a significant portion of the population finds itself in a vulnerable situation due to certain social circumstances such as wars, unemployment, and early pregnancies, rendering them unable to meet their basic social needs.

It is within this framework that Fondation Humanité ASBL has focused its attention on widows, single mothers, orphans, as well as those who have not completed their normal schooling and find themselves in a situation of dependence, with the aim of their financial and social empowerment.

The chosen option consists, on one hand, of providing them with vocational training and, on the other hand, of supporting them in the exercise of acquired skills in order to meet this challenge and enable them to contribute to societal progress.

Within this context, Fondation Humanité ASBL has been organizing vocational training since December 2022 in centres connected to the network of its partner schools, namely La Référence College in Lubumbashi and Enfants du Monde International School in Bukavu.

At the launch of the first series of training sessions, more than 200 people were recruited and enrolled in the following fields:

- 1. At the International School Children of the World in Bukavu, out of 57 enrolled for a training in Dressmaking & Tailoring, Computer Science, Mechanical fitting;
- 2. At La Référence College in Lubumbashi, a total of 107 people enrolled for a training in Dressmaking & Tailoring, Computer Science, Masonry, and Esthetics.

Given that the main objective is to enable trained individuals to master a trade in the shortest possible time, more than 60% of the training time was dedicated to practical work in various workshops and laboratories. At the end of the training, and due to social circumstances for some, a total of 138 young and adult individuals were trained in various fields.

Below the number of people trained in different fields:

- Bukavu: 22 in Dressmaking and Tailoring; 11 in Mechanical fitting; 12 Computer Science (office work);
- Lubumbashi: 30 in Dressmaking and Tailoring, 4 in Masonry, 31 in Computer Science (office work) and 28 Esthetics.
- Following these training sessions, taking into account their qualifications, the Foundation has implemented a support process for them, which involves two options:
- the first option consists of grouping a number of trained individuals by field around a common project (sewing workshop, adjustment workshop, office work, etc.) in the form of income-generating activity. The Foundation can provide some assistance for this purpose;
- the second involves, given the excellence of their training, recommending them to companies in need of highly skilled workers.

To date, Fondation Humanité ASBL is working on supporting some recipients in implementing a few pilot projects related to the training they have received.

In 2023, the Foundation saw the first fruits of vocational training sessions organized in both Lubumbashi and Bukavu, with Kinshasa being the next stage.



C. Support to schools

As part of its interventions, Fondation Humanité ASBL has chosen to support several community and private schools located on the outskirts of urban centers and/or in rural areas, which are facing precarious situations regarding their infrastructure, furniture, teaching materials, and more, in order to improve the quality of education to some extent.

With this in mind, during the General Assembly, it was decided to provide both financial means and school equipment to a total of eleven (11) schools located in five (5) provinces of the country: South Kivu, Kasaï Oriental, Kasaï Central, Haut Katanga, and Kinshasa.

During the year 2023, the Humanity Foundation provided two types of support to the schools:

1. **Financial Support:** The community schools Kamal in Lukalaba and New Garden in Baraka received financial support this year to improve the students' study conditions by carrying out certain renovations. Torrential rains had caused cracks in the walls of the former and completely destroyed the roof of the latter.

Faced with this situation, the two schools would not have been able to open their doors this year. In a timely manner, the support from the Fondation Humanité ASBL saved the 2023-2024 school year with

a significant influx of students and improved study conditions.

2. Equipment Support: Nine (9) schools received benches, blackboards, and chairs. The Noradho-Aziza, La Forteresse, Kamal, and Muzunsangabo Schools in South Kivu; Nyota ya Alfadjiri School, Buumi Orphanage School, Amirad College, Soleil School, and Sainte Véronique School in Lubumbashi.

D. Social assistance

«You live to do good and bring joy to the hearts of others.»

Despite its actions in the field of education, which is its preferred area, and given its nature, Fondation Humanité ASBL can carry out certain sporadic social interventions to alleviate, to some extent, the difficulties encountered by certain vulnerable categories of the population.

It was within this context that the General Assembly decided, at its first session, to undertake social actions where needs are most acute

To do this and in this spirit of humanism, the Foundation carried out a few actions, continuing the efforts of the year 2022:

1. Distribution of medicines to patients at the General Military Hospital of Reference of Camp Kokolo and to the elderly at the Kabinda Home in the Lingwala district.

2. Distribution of food and non-food items to orphans at the Buumi Orphanage in Lubumbashi on the occasion of the end-of-year celebrations in 2023.



3. Support for the Agricultural Cooperative: The agricultural project in Mweka was initiated in 2022 and finally led to the creation of an agricultural cooperative that operates on 30 hectares. Corn, pum pkin seeds, beans, and cassava are cultivated there. The first harvests were satisfactory.



This led the Foundation to provide the cooperative with a mill, thus sparing women and girls the effort of processing cassava and corn into flour.



E. Ngomba-kinkusa, on the move to social transformation

In line with its mission to provide holistic support aimed at contributing to the progress of the Congolese population, Fondation Humanité ASBL has built a modern school combined with a centre for radiance in Ngomba Kinkusa and a well for drinking water supply. With the involvement of this school, local notables, and other neighbourhood structures including churches, erosion control, through water channelling and bamboo planting, are some flagship initiatives that contribute significantly to the well-being of the local residents. Fondation Humanité ASBL is firmly committed to working on environmental protection and combating societal deterioration by proposing and implementing measures for environmental rehabilitation and preservation.

As described earlier, Ngomba-Kinkusa neighbourhood in Kinshasa is similar to several neighbourhoods and villages in the DRC facing countless challenges. It is not only isolated and inaccessible, but it is also ravaged by 7 major erosion heads that continue to expand day by day.

For over a year now, the population of this neighbourhood has been fighting against this scourge with the help of Fondation Humanité ASBL. A 300-meter-long water collector is under construction.

Benefiting from the support of local notables and being considered part of them, the HF initiated exchanges involving the entire neighbourhood population to reflect on the issue. It also consulted with the administration of Complexe Scolaire Humanité, making it another protagonist on which it could rely for actions involving the local community.

These spaces and exchanges have allowed all stakeholders to agree on an emergency action that could be considered a means of stopping erosion expansion. It was decided to proceed with bamboo planting on the sidelines of the National Tree Day celebrated on December 5 of each year. All these stakeholders were involved in ensuring the smooth running of the activity. Approximately 240 people participated.

The fight against erosion is a long-term endeavour; that's why Fondation Humanité ASBL considers it as a process that requires long-term efforts. Complexe Scolaire Humanité, aiming to be a school of excellence, stimulates the spirit of service to the community among students and their parents. Bamboo planting has awakened the consciousness of the population and other educational structures in the neighbourhood to get involved in anti-erosion efforts

Reflections have been initiated leading to the understanding that bamboo planting should take place over several days, involving more and more people. «Living in this neighbourhood, we are all concerned about the problems it faces,» said Mr. Sanvua Gustave, one of the neighbourhood notables during the first bamboo planting campaign.

The second bamboo-planting day will be organized on January 30, 2024, and will continue thereafter; in order to broaden the vision to churches, schools, families, and all economic operators in the neighbourhood.

Building on human values, Fondation Humanité ASBL sees the path that a population in motion and protagonist of its own progress is taking; developing necessary capacities and habits for this purpose.

F. Kelasi, a large-scale project...

«It is not desirable for a man to remain without knowledge or skills, for then he is but a sterile tree.»

At the last General Assembly, HFondation Humanité ASBL presented the Kelasi project, a 5-year project involving the construction and operationalization of 5 schools in several provinces of the DRC. To this end, the Foundation has chosen the provinces of Lualaba, Haut-Lomami, and South Kivu in the East, and Kongo Central in the West, as pilot provinces where the FH will implement the Kelasi project.

The project is already underway, as the Foundation has selected some sites. Site visits have been organized, consultations with beneficiaries conducted, needs identified, and architectural procedures initiated. Particularly for the Kolwezi site, the process is progressing well, and 2024 will be revealing.
